Day 1: Cape Town City Tour & Table Mountain

This is a great way to get an introduction to “the Mother City”, Cape Town. Go for a tour in the city and surrounding area, including the city centre, Company’s Gardens, Cape Town Castle, the Bo Kaap, Signal Hill and the V&A Waterfront. A big part of this tour is walking around the city with your guide getting to know the city, its different cultures, history and geography. A highlight of the day is riding to the top of the famous Table Mountain in a cable car, for magnificent views over Table Bay, Robben Island, The Cape Peninsula and Lions Head.

Day 2: Cape Peninsula Tour

Join us on a spectacular journey to the Cape of Good Hope, including a visit to the African Penguin colony at Boulders Beach. We'll explore Cape Point National Park on foot by taking a walk up to the lighthouse (or opt to take the "Flying Dutchman" funicular). We will then head to the Cape of Good Hope, the furthest southwestern point in Africa. Our day will include driving along the beautiful Atlantic seaside suburbs of Clifton and Camps Bay, with views of the Twelve Apostles Mountains. We will also enjoy a spectacular coastal drive along Chapman's Peak, to take in one of the best views in the region.

- [Uva Mira](#), a boutique winery situated on the slopes of the Helderberg Mountain range
- [Jordan Wine Estate](#), a picturesque family-owned estate with panoramic views over False Bay and Table Mountain
- [Warwick](#), award-winning wines and the first estate to produce a 'Cape Blend'
- [Stark-Condé](#), spectacular Cabernet Sauvignon with spectacular views
- [Babylonstoren](#), at the foot of Simonsberg Mountain in the Franschhoek wine valley, with a fruit and vegetable garden of amazing beauty and diversity
- [Boschendal](#), with its garden-to-table restaurant, historic manor buildings, garden picnics, and exceptional food & wine
- [Muratie Wine Estate](#), a Stellenbosch farm dating back to 1685, one of the oldest estates in South Africa (with the cobwebs to prove it)
- [Rust en Vrede](#), specializing in robust red wines like Cabernet Sauvignon and Syrah
- [Oldenberg](#), a hidden gem with great views of the Banhoek Valley

- Your guide will be available to do the activities mentioned in this itinerary, which is generally 8-10 hours for a full day. If you would like additional help planning evening activities and dinner, please speak to your guide – he or she can assist you with making arrangements for evening taxis or dinner reservations.
- All vehicles have valid operating licences to convey paying customers.
- Please advise in advance if you require a car seat for children booked on the tour. Car seats are available at an additional charge. Maximum 2 children per adult at standard rate; please enquire for groups with more children. Infants under age 2 free of charge.
- All guides are well trained, experienced, and African born. By law we are required to use CATHSSETA registered and qualified guides with professional drivers' licenses.

- We require a 20% deposit to confirm a tour. The balance of the payment is due 30 days before tour departure.
- Cancellation policy (private tours):
 - Cancellation 31+ days before departure date: fee of 15% of total tour price
 - Cancellation 30 days – 15 days before departure date: fee of 50% of total tour price
 - Cancellation 14 days – 8 days before departure date: fee of 75% of total tour price
 - Cancellation 7 days or less or no show for departure date: fee of 100% of total tour price
- Tour price is dependent on group size and vehicle size. Should the group size fluctuate from the original quote, your Earthstompers consultant will provide you with a revised quote.
- All Earthstompers tours are priced in South African Rand (R or ZAR). In case of a refund, any amount will be refunded in South African Rand, which then gets converted to your local currency by your bank or credit card company.
